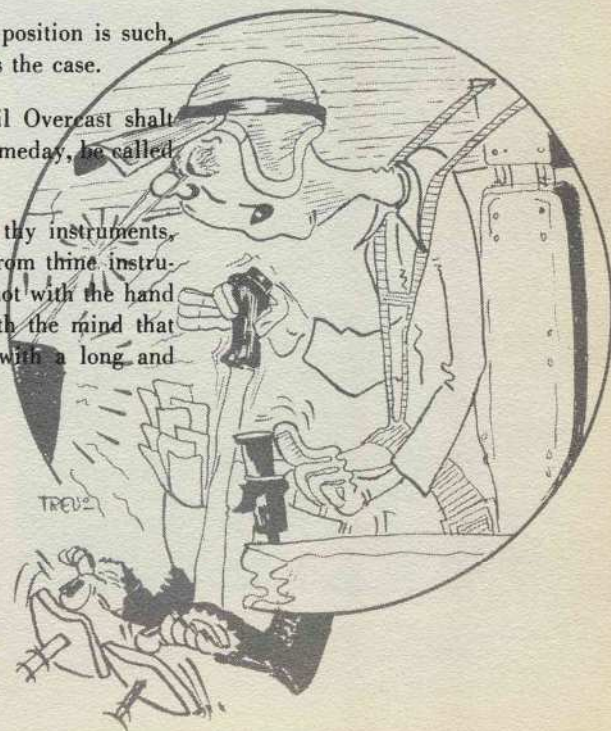
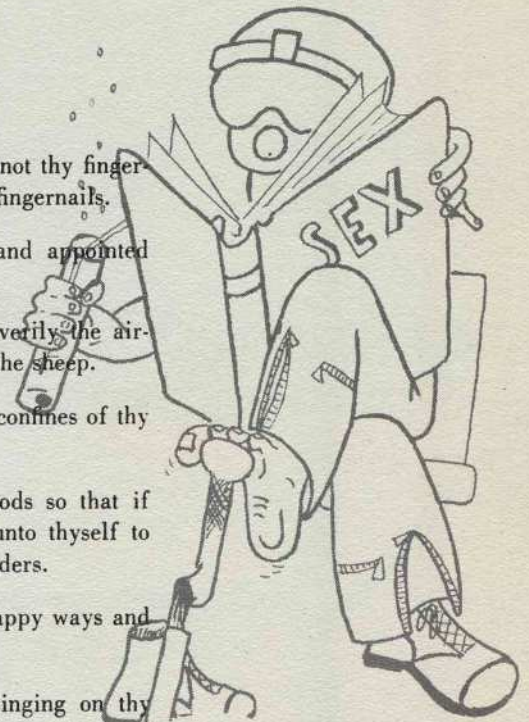
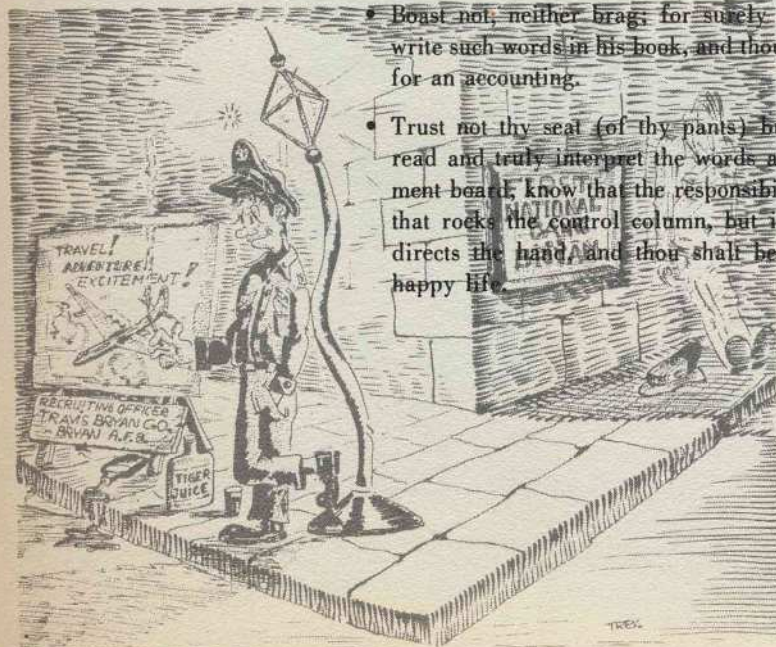


# The Ten Commandments For An Instrument Pilot

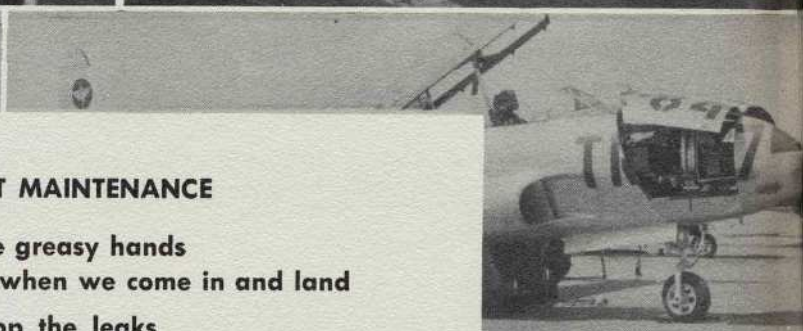
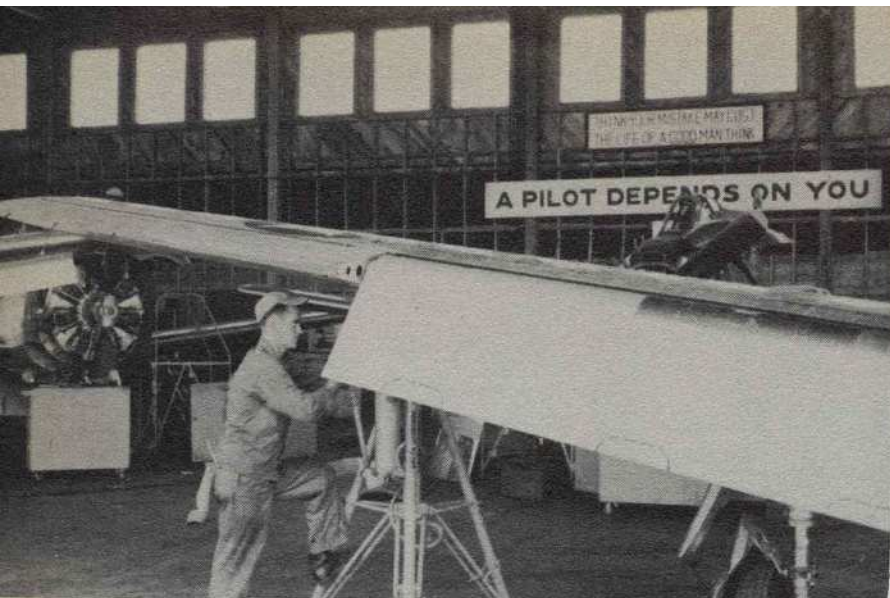
# The Pilots' 23rd Psalm

13. Hear instruction and be wise, and refuse it not; thus wilt thou fly safely; length of days and a life of peace shall be added unto thee.

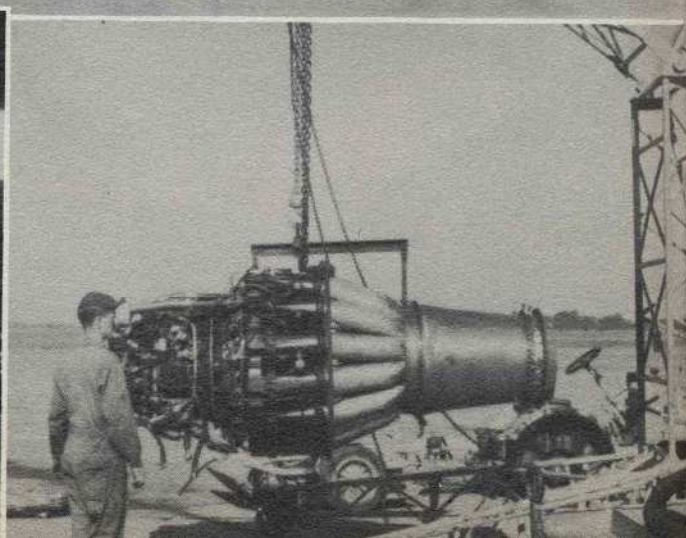
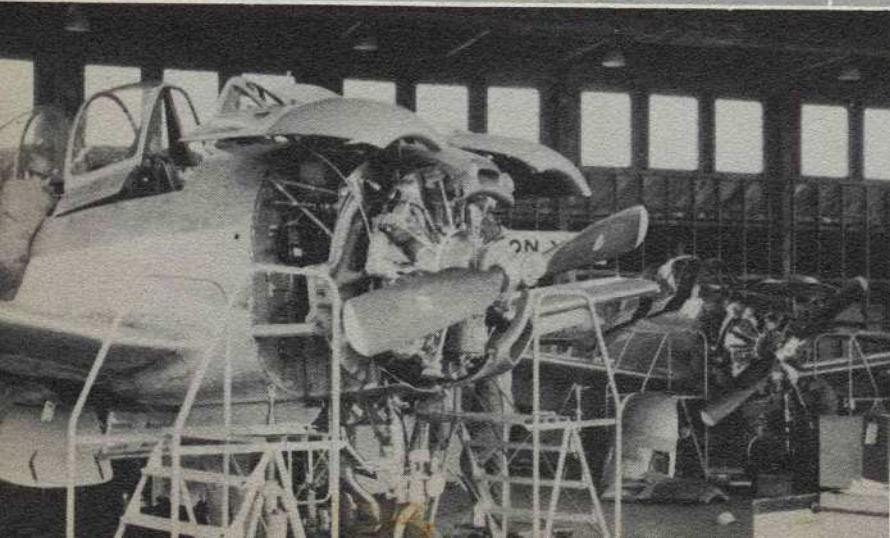
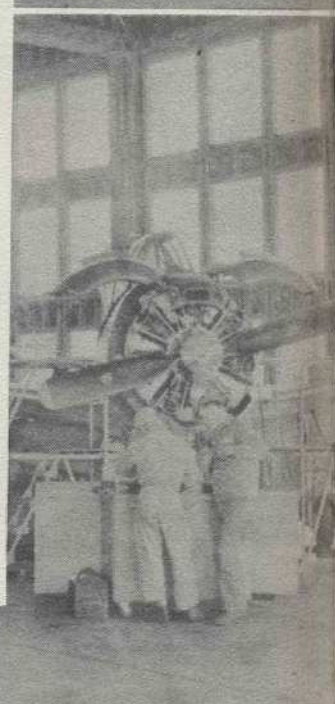




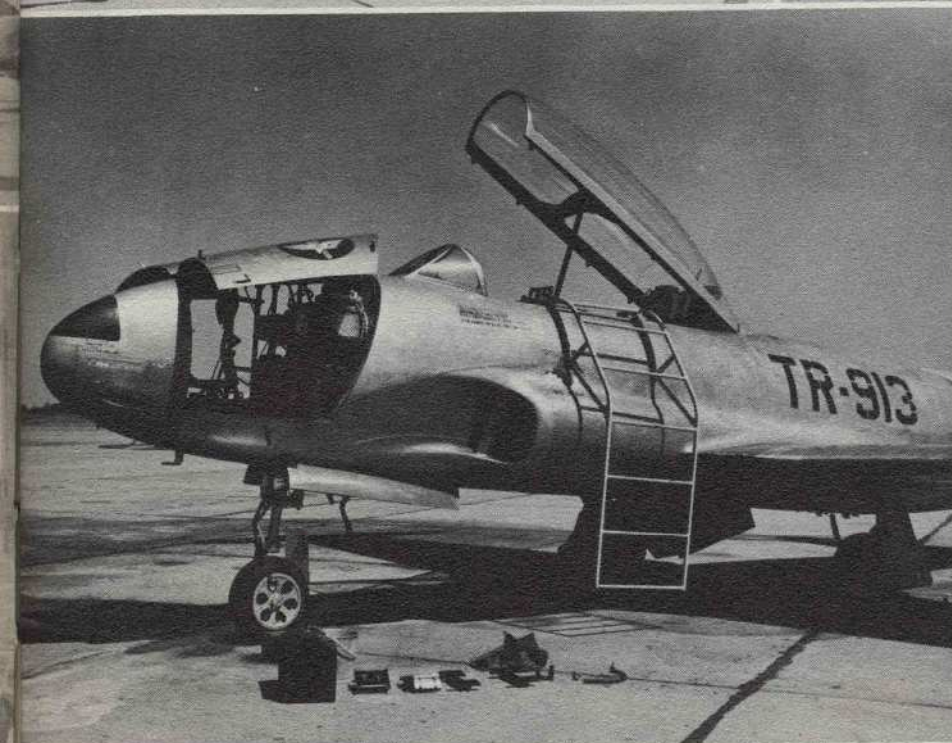
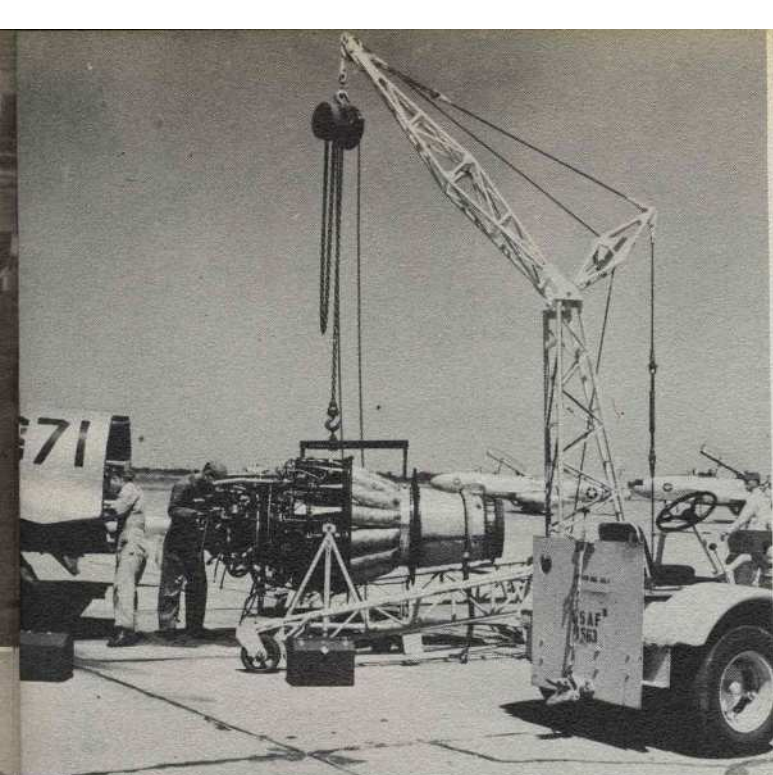


### AIRCRAFT MAINTENANCE
